Safety Stand Down Week

Time: ~15 minutes

Intro (1 minute) Read aloud:

We're on the home stretch. So far we've talked about what a fire is and prevention. Today we're moving into response.

Safety is a core value at our company. We want everyone to go home at the end of their shift in the same condition they came in.

Knowing what to do, even in a "small fire", can help. We have established procedures for responding to a fire. Know your role.

Pre-Quiz (2 minutes) Ask out loud. Don't correct anyone yet.

- Q1. Who can tell me what an incipient stage fire is?
- Q2. When is a fire no longer in the incipient stage?
- Q3. What should you do if you see a fire?

Play the video.

Post-Video Quiz (4 minutes) Review again. This time, provide correct answers.

- Q1. Who can tell me what an incipient stage fire is?
A1. Just beginning; only the fuels first involved are still burning, very small, localized.
- Q2. When is a fire no longer in the incipient stage?
A2. Spreading, heavy smoke, hard to see or breathe.
- Q3. What should you do if you see a fire?
A3. Follow the site's fire response plan. Never let a fire get between you and your exit.

Site-Specific Discussion

- Who can use a fire extinguisher at this operation?
- What's our site-specific fire response plan?
- Where is our rally point?

Close (1 minute) Read aloud:

At the end of the day, we want everyone to go home safely. When a fire is no longer in the incipient stage, it's time for everyone to evacuate, which we'll talk more about tomorrow.

We have procedures for a fire of any level for a reason: To keep you safe.

Remember, do it safely, or not at all.
